### Workshop and Hands on Training on 'Cut Flower Arrangements and Preparation of Herbal Medicines'

A one day workshop and hands on training on 'Cut flower arrangements & preparation of herbal medicines' was held on March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2016 in Department of Botany, Kongunadu Arts and Science College, Coimbatore. The program was conducted under DBT – STAR College scheme. The staff members, research scholars and UG & PG students of various departments participated in this workshop.

It was a day brimming with the twinkling and astonishing eyes of the audience, awaiting for the event to start. By invoking the deity by a hymn, we seeked his assistance and guidance and put a start for the event. Dr. S. Manorama, Associate Professor & Head, Department of Botany has welcomed the gathering. Then all the dignitaries lighted the kuthuvilakku seeking the blessing of the lord of wisdom. Dr. T. facts regarding medicinal plants and instructed the ways to explore it in future without exploiting the nature and the natural vegetation.

The last session was on 'Ethno medicine' and was carried out by Dr. R. Ravi, Assistant Professor in Botany, Govt. Arts College, Ooty. The session was fully occupied with positive aspects of ethno medicine. He explained about the traditional indigenous knowledge, tribal communities in South India, contributions of Ethno medicine in Pharmacology etc. These topics were well explained with many practical experiences.

After the completion of these three sessions, there were also several demonstrations as a part of the workshop. It opened new vistas of flora and herbal medicines, when Mr. Partheban, Research Scholar, Bharathiar University, Coimbatore and Dr. P. Sumathi, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany, Kongunadu Arts and Science College demonstrated about the demonstrations on Cut flowers and their types of arrangements and herbal products. The cut flower demonstration was highly appreciable in a way that it depicted the natural beauty of flower arrangement. All became mere observers to the amusing demonstration of flowers. The demonstration of herbal medicines and herbal products was very innovative and quite interesting.
