Book Launch of Shri. Deepak Karanjikar's GHATSUTRA on 25.06.2023

On behalf of KASC, PG Department of English represented to attend the book launch of author Shri. Deepak Karanjikar invited by Veranda Club at Varsha Hall, Coimbatore on 25th June Sunday. Under the supervision of Dr.G.Youveniya, eight faculty members and four II PG students attended the programme. The event started by 4.15 pm with welcome address. In the welcome address the author and his achievements were highlighted. It was told that Shri. Deepak Karanjikar is an author, Marathi film actor, Producer, and a lyricist. He was Chairman, National Mission for cultural mapping, ministry of culture, Govt. of India. He was a consultant for process & People utilization at University Grants Commission. Followed by the welcome speech was the special address of Swami Sriram Dasa, ISKCON Spiritual leader. He spoke about the book and how economy can be seen with the perspectives of Theology. Followed by him Shri Ashok Jain, Founder-Bhavya Bharath Foundation, delivered his wishes for the success of this book and congratulated the author. Shri.Arvind Chawla, MD MEPL SiddhoHum Pvt.Ltd addressed the forum about the features of the book Ghatsutra, its first publication in Marathi and the first book release in Chennai.

After the introductory notes Prof. Kangasabapathi, past Chairman ICSR gave an enormous explanation on Economics and Finance. Then the forum was informed that the expanded version of Ghatsutra II will be published on 2025 and another book concerning Indian economy behind Indian Culture has been planned to be published in 2027 under the title Marthsutra. The significance of the gathering is to understand and value the concepts of economics and finance. During this address the forum were also enlightened with the fact and theories of how western influence dominates Indian economy. 






GUEST LECTURE ON RESEARCH METHODOLOGY
