III. EVENTS

Student Induction Programme-2023 was started with invocation followed by welcome address by Dr.R.Thirugnanasampandan, SIP Coordinator and Dr. M. Lekeshmanaswamy, Principal offered the felicitation.

Day1: Talk on Human Values

Swami Buddhidhananda Maharaj, Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu talked about human values. Day 2: Talk on Say no to Tobacco

Mr. K Murali Krishnan, District Tobacco Control Cell, Deputy Director of Health Services, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu delivered the talk on Say no to tobacco

The session is concerning with the increasing rate of addiction towards tobacco and tobacco related products in our society, especially among the school and college students. The speakers highlighted on the adverse effects of all kinds of tobacco products by clearly explaining about the materials which are used for producing those products, that are very harmful for our organs. Some of the research records showing the health effects are shown clearly to make the students understand the deadly effects of tobacco. Overall session focused on motivating and advising students to completely avoid using tobacco and related products to lead a sound and healthy life for now and forever. At the end of the session, everyone took a pledge “*say no to tobacco*” for their healthy life and surroundings.



Day 3: Talk on How to become an Entrepreneur

Mr. Naveen Manickam, Business Coach, Founder NM Enterprises, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu was the resource person. The main objective of the talk was to inculcate the process of entrepreneurship among students and to raise a basic understanding about entrepreneurial concepts.

Resource person introduced the concept of entrepreneurship by focusing on taking risk which is the major quality of an entrepreneur. Creative thinking is the only ingredient in a recipe for business. Mr. Naveen Manickam mentioned that the people do not start their new ventures in a country like India is due to the lack of awareness of entrepreneurship so they decide to go for jobs in private or government sector so as to minimize the risk. Resource person explained in detail about the various attributes of successful entrepreneurs such as drive, communication skills and technical skills. The concept was further deliberated on the start-up business in India followed by a discussion on contemporary business environment in our country.



Day 4: Talk on Cyber Security and Human Welfare

Mr. Anand, Sub inspector of Police, Technical-Cybercrime Wing, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu was the resource person. The resource person cautioned that a cyberattack occurs when a person utilizes a public computer or network without authorization which leads to hacking, phishing, malware and virus attack. He also insisted the students to avoid opening attachments or clicking of links received from unidentified sources and to be cautious of the disclosures online as it is a crucial component of cyber security. Also one should not share home address, phone number and other personal data which lead to unwanted risks. It's crucial to report any suspicious activities or possible cyberattacks in addition to taking precautions for their own safety. He also advised to avoid responding to strange emails and messages and explained the punishments and other legal issues for cybercrimes.

Talk on First Aid

Mr. Karthick, Alert NGO, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu delivered a talk on PEER basics-Personal Empowerment Emergency Response. He taught about inactivity, which is actually killing people, so First-Aid is very necessary and the person who is rushing to save a person met with accident should know some basic things like calling ambulance, holding the injured person properly and make sure that there should not be any contact with blood of injured person etc. Finally, he performed a demo with student volunteers about CPR method.



Day 5: Talk on Placement Opportunities

Mr. Karunakaran, Deputy Director, District Employment and Career Guidance Centre, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu

Mr. Karunakaran addressed on the importance of communication among students. The resource person advised the students to read employment newspaper to know about advertisement from various state and central government jobs. Further he added, lateral and logical thinking is important to sustain in the job market. He also emphasized on the importance of doing extra courses which are required as additional qualification for getting jobs easily. Moreover, he advised the students to prepare themselves for interview from the first year onwards. Resource person shared the information about free coaching classes offered for UPSC, TNPSC, RRB and SSC exams for the benefit of students. Finally, alumni, Ms. Keerthana who got placed in TCS shared her experience about resume preparation, facing of placement interview, group discussion etc.



Day 6: Introduction of Club activities

The respective coordinators introduced their clubs to the students and explained their mechanisms of operation, roles and responsibilities, accomplishments, social services, etc. Other clubs and activities such as the student welfare center, entrepreneurial development cell (EDC), institution innovation cell (IIC), KASC- Tech Hub, IPR cell, and i-Hub were also introduced. The organizers produced a Google form and distributed it to the students for club enrollment.



Afternoon activities

Familiarization with Department

The relevant Department Heads, Faculties, Mentors, and Nonteaching staff were introduced to the students of each department. Members of the teaching and support staff gave introductions to the students. The department Heads gave details on things like the year the program was introduced, student enrollment, program results and program specific results, core papers, allied, elective, and skill-based subjects, internal and external mark distribution systems, college scheduling, discipline, and dress code etc. Notable Alumni were also addressed in addition to the department's strengths and accomplishments.



Creative Arts and Culture Activity

Each department conducted creative arts and cultural session in the afternoon of the second day. The students were asked to express their interest in the field of arts and culture. They were requested to submit their original artwork in the form of a drawing on a timely topic, such as traditional, monumental etc. The students actively participated and listed their cultural and creative interests. Additionally, the students were invited to express their gratitude to those who had helped them.



Literary activity

The advantages of the National Digital Library of India (NDLI) were taught to first-year students in each department as part of a literary activity. Students were walked through each step of creating an account in NDLI and logging in to access the subject material immediately. Students were also urged to download e-books from a variety of other fields of science and technology, literature, and other subjects. They were also informed about the availability of video lectures, audio books, research databases, test questions, and other resources. Students were also led through the library to locate literature that piqued their interests.

Lab Tour

Additional instruction on standard operating procedures and fundamental laboratory safety measures was given. Students were also taken to museum, computer lab, garment designing lab and greenhouse.



Physical Activity

The physical education department staff taught the students physical activities like athletics, yoga, meditation, and sports. In order to preserve good health and fitness, students were advised to regularly engage in physical activity. They were also urged to take part in a variety of sporting events. The value of preparing your own meals and adopting healthy lifestyle choices were discussed and recommended to maintain physical fitness.
