Er. Thiru. R. Somasundaram, chaired the Meeting and extended a warm welcome to the Members of the Governing Body who were present for the meeting and to Shri.P.Haridasji, the Senior Member who was present online for the meeting.

ITEM 1: CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF THE THIRTY THIRD GOVERNING BODY MEETING

In the absence of any clarification / comments received from the members, recording of the minutes of the Thirty Third Meeting of the Governing Body held on 11.11.2024 and communicated to the members on 10.12.2024 was confirmed and recorded.

ITEM 2: ACTION TAKEN ON THE SUGGESTIONS PROPOSED BY THE MEMBERS

The Members perused the details and recorded the same.

ITEM 3: ACADEMIC PROCEEDINGS

i) DEPARTMENT RECOGNITION

When the members deliberated on the introduction of new course, viz., B.Com in Logistics and Supply Chain Management from the academic year 2025-2026 onwards, Dr.Thavamani D. Palaniswami, the Member asked whether there is a need for getting Equivalence certificate for this course for the students to pursue PG program. For this, the Secretary informed that TANSCHE syllabus has been adopted in the ensuing academic year and the Equivalence will be obtained for all the substream of Commerce Courses. Dr.Thavamani D. Palaniswami, the Member further suggested to add more inputs through value added courses to bridge the gap between the TANSCHE syllabus and existing one through implementing the career oriented industrial skill/knowledge on commerce. She advised the faculty members to spend extra hours with the students to impart the required skills for their employment.

At this juncture, the Secretary brought to the notice of the members that the online course 'COURSERA' will be introduced and made compulsory for the Self Financing students for their upskilling and reskilling in which the staff members will be the Mentors and the students can earn 'Extra credits'.

Dr. Thavamani D. Palaniswami, the Member asked the level of awareness of

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COURSERA among the students. For this, Dr. M. Revathi Bala, the Teacher Member replied that the values of COURSERA will be highlighted among the staff members and students through departmental meetings. Dr. Thavamani D. Palaniswami, the member further suggested to collect the additional fees at the initial stages of self finance admission itself. The Secretary accepted this suggestion.

(ii) ADMISSION TO UG & PG PROGRAMMES FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2024-2025

Er. Thiru. Somasundaram, the Chairperson observed that the admission in the year 2024-2025 was:

Aided: UG : 51% PG : 60% Unaided UG : 76% PG : 45%

The Chairperson asked the reason for the low admission percentage in Unaided PG programme. The Secretary of the College, Dr.C.A.Vasuki and Dr.Thavamani D. Palaniswami, Member stated that students do not opt for pursuing their higher studies – PG in Science courses, Mathematics and also English.

The Secretary also said that the nomenclature of the courses have to be changed by mentioning A.I. and Computer Applications (CA) to attract the students to choose them. Also she mentioned that the Teachers in Schools must create interest for the students in Science, Mathematics and English Literature subjects.

Dr.Thavamani D. Palaniswami agreed to the above fact and said courses have to be computer oriented as the present students are not willing to take any course without computer subjects/applications.

(iii) EXAMINATION RESULTS, NOVEMBER 2024:

The Members perused the details and noted. They also congratulated the departments who have excelled in securing 100% Result. They also advised that few departments which lag behind with less percentage can improve the results in the ensuing semesters by applying relevant remedial measures.

(iv) STUDENTS INDUCTION PROGRAMME (SIP) 2024

The Members perused the details, noted and recorded the same.

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(v) VISIT OF ACADEMIC AUDIT COMMITTEE

The Chairperson, Er.Thiru.Somasundaram recollected that during the previous meeting, the performance of few departments (Computer Science & IT) has been reported 'poor' by the Academic Audit Committee and enquired whether those departments have improved. Dr. M. Revathi Bala, the Member said that departmental staff meetings had been conducted and action plan for improvement had been drawn up and those departments have improved their performance.

The Chairperson while appreciating the departments which were good in their performance in the current report, also informed that the departments which lagmust improve their standards hereafter. The Secretary advised the Principal to follow up on the same. The Secretary also informed the Members that the Department of Commerce strives for continuous improvement year after year.

Dr. Thavamani D. Palaniswami, the Member advised to focus on industry-academic partnership. She also expressed with concern that the skills imparted to the students in the classrooms are not adequate; in addition, Tie ups/Links with the Industries need to be organized, lectures by experts invited from industries may be arranged and the industry based skills/knowledge have to be taught to the students to make them potential when seeking employment. At the same time, department-wise Faculty Development Programmes, viz., Computer Science, IT, Commerce, etc. for teachers should also to be organized to equip themselves in the current scenario.

(vi) MEETINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

Dr. M. Revathi Bala, the member informed that as suggested in the previous meeting of the IQAC, remedial classes were taken for the classes with less pass percentage to help the students to improve their studies.

While discussing about the Research publications as per the suggestion of the IQAC Members, she further said, it has been planned to publish the articles in Scopus journals instead of UGC care list. Dr.Thavamani D. Palaniswami, member stated that it will take one solid year to publish such journals, for which Dr. M. Revathi Bala informed that the duration for free journals only is one year and paid journals can be released immediately at a short time.

Sri.P.Haridasji, the Senior member congratulated the Teaching faculty concerned for their research contributions.

(vii) ICT ACADEMY ACTIVITIES

The Members perused the details and appreciated Dr. L. Kathirvel Kumaran, Assistant Professor and Head, Department of CSDA and ICT Academy Coordinator for getting the BEST Coordinator 2024 Award for his outstanding performance and also for getting the Special recognition Award for his leadership during the Learnathon 2023.

The Members noted about the receipt of Seven Awards by the Institution at 57th Edition ICT Academy Bridge 2024 entitled on "The Global Skill Capital" (A High Impact Industry Institute Interactions Event) held on 20.08.2024 and presented by R. Kannan IAS, Managing Director, Electronics Corporations of Tamil Nadu. The Members appreciated the Faculty members who have been instrumental in getting the same.

MongoDB Academic Summit 2024

The Members noted and appreciated the Institution for having been honoured with an award from MongoDB for Providing Exceptional Guidance and Support to Student and Institution Partners during the Success 2024 initiative. They also appreciated Dr.L.Kathirvel Kumaran for having been recognized as the MongoDB Academic Summit Distinguished Mentor 2024.

(viii) MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU)

The Members perused the details and appreciated on various International and National Level MoUs signed by the College. They also suggested to achieve fruitful outcomes out of the same.

(ix) SWAYAM / MOOCs

It was informed to the Members that SWAYAM has been made mandatory and hence the students are encouraged to clear the courses within the stipulated time.

(x) Professional Courses

The Members perused the details and congratulated the students who have cleared the Foundation and Inter-mediate layers of C.A. and C.M.A. professional courses.

(i) India Rankings 2024 (NIRF)

All the Members of the Governing Body congratulated the Management and the Faculty for their contribution for securing 52nd Rank.

(ii) KASC - Institution Innovation Council (IIC) 2024

It was informed to the Members that the points secured during the last year was 3.0 out of 5 and during this year, it has increased to 3.5 out of 5 due to more activities organised by IIC of the College. Sri.P.Haridasji, the Senior Member and all the other members congratulated the members of IIC for the same.

The award was presented to her at the 14th Professional and Career Women Global Award Ceremony 2024 held at Kualalumbur, Malaysia on 07.11.2024. Dr. C. A. Vasuki, Secretary encouraged the Department of Chemistry and the Department of Physics to offer 'Metallurgy' and 'Semi-conductor' as PG Diploma programmes respectively to grab the special placement opportunities in the industry side.
